Healthcare Transition

Preparing for the move from children's to adult services is referred to as healthcare transition. This transition occurs in mid adolescence; adolescence can be defined as the period between childhood and adulthood characterised by the onset of puberty up until the brain fully maturing, which is currently thought to be about mid-twenties. The transfer from children's to adult services is a critical time in a young person's life and like all transitions it presents both risk and opportunity (Northumbria, NHS 2017). There is a substantial body of evidence showing that morbidity and mortality increases for young people following the move from children's to adult services.

Burdett National Transition Nursing Network



The Burdett Trust are funding a National Transition Nursing Network project team. The project has a national Lead Nurse hosted by Leeds Teaching Hospital NHS Trust. The Lead Nurse works with four Regional Nurse Advisors (RNAs) placed strategically across England in the North, Midlands, London and South. The RNA for the Midlands and East of England is Nathan Samuels who is hosted by University Hospitals Birmingham. The project team are mapping the current state of transition across England, creating a database of transition contacts and sharing the implementation of the Quality Improvement model.



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National Updates

NHSE/I 0-25 years model of care framework for transition coming Summer 2022!

The Burdett National Transition Team has been working with NHSE/I to produce the 0-25 years model of care framework for transition. The framework is finalised and we are awaiting a publication date.

NHSEI Core Competency and Capability framework for Transition

Training has been identified as one of the biggest gaps in transition. The Burdett National Transition Team have been working closely with NHS E/I and Skills for Heath to develop a competency framework. The Framework articulates the core capabilities describing the knowledge, skills and behaviours required by all healthcare staff working with young people. Currently there is no national framework that addresses this need.

This will cover 3 tiers:

- 1. Anyone looking after a YP
- 2. Those working directly with YP and transition
- Those working in roles providing whole organisation change around Transition

COC- Adult Briefing Paper

The Burdett National Transition Team have been working in partnership with NHSE/land leads from CQC Young People/Adult teams to co-produce an inspection briefing paper around care of young people and transition in adult services after CQC identified a lack of transition evaluations in adult inspections.





National Confidential Enquiry into Patient Outcome and Death (NCEPOD)

A NCEPOD Study is taking place to explore the barriers and facilitators in the process of the transition of young people with complex chronic conditions from child to adult health services. As a Trust, we were required to provide initial data information with 15 cases selected for records and respective clinician questionnaire to be submitted.
