

Urine Monovette® – Points to remember



- 2. Remove stopper and keep (do not throw away).
- 3. Attach straw by pushing onto the Luer end of the Monovette.
- **4**. Holding the tube, place the tip of the straw into the urine and begin to pull back on the plunger.
- **5**. Draw the plunger <u>only</u> to the line, remove the tip from the urine and turn the tube upside down so that the tip is facing upwards and the plunger faces the floor.
- 6. Pull the plunger back to the end click into place which will remove the excess urine from the straw and prevent spillage.
- 7. Remove and discard of straw.
- 8. Replace stopper.
- 9. Snap off the plunger and discard.

10. Label and place into specimen bag.
