



PERIPrem Passport Launch Party

Monday 30th September 2024

We will be launching the PERIPrem clinical passport, baby passport and parent information leaflet on Monday 30th September across maternity and neonates.

Please join us outside the Matrons' Office (at the bottom of the stairs) for more information and cake on the launch day – 30th September 10am -2pm!

PERIPrem (Perinatal Excellence to Reduce Injury in Premature Birth) is a bundle of 11 interventions that have been shown to have a significant impact on brain injury and mortality rates in babies born prematurely. We have already implemented all 11 elements into our standard practice for the care of mothers and babies.

The parent information leaflet provides women and families with information about all 11 interventions.

The baby passport is designed to involve parents in the care of both mother and baby by allowing them to record the interventions that they have received. It is kept with the mother and transferred with the baby to NNU.

The clinical passport records the interventions that have been received and the reason if an intervention has not been received. This will allow us to identify areas of success and areas for improvement.
